The Chaco Field Schools. Preparing a history of the field schools conducted from 1929 through 1942 and again in 1947, initially sponsored by the University of New Mexico and the School of American Research; after 1935 sessions by the University of New Mexico alone.

Currently pulling together a site report on Talus Unit No. 1.

The ASNM field schools in Heaton Canyon. Located outside of Gallup, NM, is a community that includes settlements from Ancestral Pueblo through Historic periods. Members of both the Gallup Archaeological Society and the Archaeological Society of New Mexico cooperated on conduct of field schools that surveyed the canyon, excavated a number of small sites and the great kiva (known as the Vidal Site). Since 2008 I have gone through records of Richard Bice, former director who died that year, to complete the compilation of a report on this work, some of which was co-sponsored by UNM. A draft report has been handed in to the ASNM special publications editor for review. The artifacts and archival material currently held at the Maxwell Museum is being inventoried prior to transfer to the Museum of Indian Arts and Culture/Laboratory of Anthropology, the repository that holds ASNM materials.

Turquoise Research Results. Two papers written collaboration with younger scholars have been submitted to editors for inclusion in a volume on prehistoric quarries and one resulting from an SAA symposium comparing turquoise acquisition and use in the Old and New Worlds.
