Short Narrative Description of Research, Teaching and Service Interests

Dr. Loa Traxler received her training in Anthropological Archaeology at the University of Pennsylvania, and her experience includes over thirty-five years of field investigation, survey, curation, and collections management at sites throughout the world. As a principal member, she has worked with projects investigating a wide range of cultural traditions – from 17th century pueblo life in the Upper Río Grande, to the ancient city of Petra in southern Jordan, and the Classic Maya kingdom of Copan in western Honduras.

Traxler’s archaeological research focuses on the architectural evolution of Classic Maya centers and the nature of sociopolitical organization of these societies. As an archaeologist and surveyor, she completed her doctoral research with the Early Copan Acropolis Program for the University of Pennsylvania Museum and continues to lead research, conservation, and publication efforts for that multi-faceted project. In her field investigations, Traxler excavated royal architecture and related features within the monumental center of this Classic Maya capital.

Her current research focuses on synthesis of results from excavations within the 5th to 7th century CE architectural phases of the Copan Acropolis, including royal burials and ritual deposits associated with the first ten rulers in the dynastic line of the Classic kingdom. The architecture of the early core of the Acropolis is the subject of the initial volumes for the *Early Classic Acropolis Reports* series, currently in preparation for the University of Pennsylvania Museum. Analyses of the funerary assemblage of the 8th ruler, including decorated ceramic vessels documented using computed tomography imaging, are the subject of a journal manuscript also in preparation. Her publications include the 2016 co-edited volume, *The Origins of Maya States*, with a co-authored preface and introductory chapter, as well as peer-reviewed articles and contributions to published series in both English and Spanish. With her colleague, Robert J. Sharer, the scholarly reference, *The Ancient Maya, 6th edition*, was published by Stanford University Press in 2006 and appeared in Chinese translation in 2023.

At the University of New Mexico, Traxler leads courses in Museum Studies and Anthropology with the goal of expanding professional training and research opportunities for diverse students. As the Director of Museum Studies, she is responsible for administration, curriculum development, instruction, and assessment for the Undergraduate and Graduate Minor, Certificates, and Master in Museum Studies degree programs. For the Museum Studies curriculum, engaging students from multiple academic disciplines, Traxler teaches introductory courses and leads seminars in Digital Approaches, NAGPRA & Museums, Museum Collection Management, and Collections in Context, among other topics. As Associate Professor of Anthropology, Traxler teaches survey courses exploring archaeology of the Americas with particular focus in Mesoamerican prehistory and Maya civilization. For both programs, she mentors students in their academic studies and professional development toward completion of doctoral and masters degrees.

In addition to her research, teaching, and administrative work, Traxler serves the university and professional community in multiple roles. She currently serves on the UNM Museum Council, the Historic Preservation Committee, and faculty committees for the NSF-funded Museum

Research Traineeship Program and the Maxwell Museum. She is active in the New Mexico Association of Museums, and she serves on multiple committees for the Society for American Archaeology, including the Committee on the Americas. She also serves as the Class III Committee Chair (Social and Behavioral Sciences) for the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and is an officer and member of the Board of Directors for two charitable organizations supporting museums and cultural heritage in Latin America.
