Chaco Canyon National Historical Park, New Mexico
2025 Summer Session: June 2 to July 11

This summer's field session will take place at Chaco Canyon National Historical Park, New Mexico. Students will gain essential hands-on training in archaeological survey and site recording. Our work will focus on identifying and documenting archaeological sites along the Chaco Wash in the bottom of the canyon. We will also have fieldtrips to various Chacoan great houses and other archaeological sites in the canyon and across northwestern New Mexico. Students will camp in the Park, and both food and transportation will be provided.

Hibben Undergraduate Fellowship:

Eligible students may be considered for the Hibben Undergraduate Fellowship for Native American, Hawaiian, Alaskan, and Pacific Islanders providing basic field training in archaeology. The fellowship covers UNM tuition and course fees (6 credit hours, Anth 375), up to \$1000 in travel costs, and a stipend of \$3000. Recipients will participate in an additional two weeks preparing a final paper and/or poster on the student's own time.
